Knodishall Community Defibrillator

Knodishall is very fortunate to have been awarded a community defibrillator through a British Heart Foundation initiative, funded by the Department of Health. The defibrillator is available for anyone to use and is situated on the outside wall of Crisps Garage, directly opposite the shop. We are very grateful to Crisps for allowing it be sited in this prominent position in the village, and for their help in installing it. Do please make yourself aware of its location in case you need it in an emergency.

Every year in the UK 30,000 cardiac arrests occur out of hospital. That's 30,000 opportunities to help save a life. Cardiac arrests are often witnessed by family members or friends. Without help the person will die within minutes. But in some cases effective and immediate CPR can help double the chance of survival.

Cardiac arrest is the ultimate medical emergency. When someone has a cardiac arrest their heart goes into life threatening rhythm and stops pumping blood around their body and to their brain. It causes the person to fall unconscious and stop breathing normally. By performing chest compressions and rescue breaths (CPR) you are taking over the role of their heart and lungs, pumping blood and oxygen to their vital organs. As with every emergency your first call will be to 999. If appropriate they will give you a code to unlock the defribrillator so you can it to the patient.

To raise awareness of our community defibrillator the Parish Council has arranged an informal drop in session in the Village Hall on Saturday July 29th, from 10.30am and 12.30pm. It is open to everyone and we hope as many of you as possible will come along see how to be lifesavers.

Village Litter Pick, Saturday July 15th

We have had several comments on how nice the village is looking at present, but litter and fly tipping continue to be a problem. If you see anyone dumping rubbish, please report it to SCDC on 01394 444000, along with any details that might help identify and trace those responsible, including the registration number of any vehicle involved.

Meanwhile we shall be holding a litter pick on Saturday July 15th. Meet at the Village Hall at 10am to collect gloves and sacks, and stop for refreshments afterwards. Families and people of all ages are welcome to come and help tidy up our village.

Defibrillator Awareness Sat July 29th

Learn how to recognise cardiac arrest, carry out CPR and familiarise yourself with the use of a defibrillator. This is an informal drop in session from 10.30am to 12.30pm in the Village Hall. We hope as many people as possible will want to learn these basic skills and become lifesavers.

Marathon Man

I would like to thank all the people who supported me and sponsored my recent run in the London Marathon. We raised well over £2000 for Macmillan Cancer Support and the Ipswich Hospital which I have attended for 17 years.

It is 15 years since I was knocked off my bike and badly injured. This brought an end to my running career and marathons. But I wanted to try and give hope to other cancer patients and to say it is tough but you can go on doing a lot more than we all think.

I had forgotten how tough the training for a marathon was. I was up at 6am swimming 3 mornings a week, running in the pool for 90 minutes, weight training 3 days a week for 85 minutes to gain upper body strength, then out on the crutches 4 days week for up to 6 hours per session. I was asked if I was doing it on crutches for a gimmick but I can assure you I was not and I have to use the crutches.

London was an amazing experience. I had massive support all the way round, people chanting my name and saying I had inspired them, which was my hope. I had great support from Macmillian before and on the course, plus my club members that came along. Wendy and Sarah were really good before and on day having coffee ready for me for me at mile 13 and mile 21. I finished in 6 hours 50 minutes with burst blisters on both hands. I hope and pray that this has given hope and inspiration to all cancer patients. *Gordon Merfield*

A Villager's Notes

Another June, and it's back to the polling stations for us all. It does seem a bit chaotic this time, hard to read the tea leaves as such, and with the forecasters having been so hopelessly inaccurate in the past, I decided to conduct my own survey in the confines of my garden.

There are some vivid Cornflowers and a very pretty feathery blue display from what I had thought were weeds; some stalwart and upstanding navy blue Irises and a few, slightly paler blue Lupins; a purplish Foxglove completes this section and I have put it down as a floating voter.

The Roses are mostly white which is confusing but perhaps like many of us they are just fed up with making decisions; however, of them all, the most vigorous is a vibrant blood red specimen. This is closely supported by a recently blooming hardy perennial which I gather is known as Hot Lips for what are now obvious reasons. In addition there is a cluster of pink Carnations and a slightly wilting pinkish 'Bottlebrush' which could be turning.

There were two or three bright yellow blooms on another Rose a couple of weeks ago but, though it still shows lots of life, it is no longer in flower and no further buds to be seen. However, all three tomato plants in their grow bag are doing well but you cannot help thinking the golden flowers will probably turn red or green as their fruit ripens.

An inconclusive picture and hard to draw any conclusions; overall Green is by far the most prevalent colour which frankly leaves me rather stumped.

The Common Rambler

The Common has again been blessed with the presence of the usual migrant birds. The chiffchaff appeared in the middle of March and will call right through into late summer. About two weeks later a black cap was calling in the Post Office Road area. Then a little later a nightingale was singing behind the two benches on the old football field. In two areas, one in the scrub near the Old Post Office bridge and the other behind the two benches, there have been two pairs of whitethroats. They frequent patches of bramble and low bushes. Their scratchy song is delivered either in flight or from the top of a bush. It was a delight to see several linnets, a bird usually associated with gorse.

The meadow saxifrage near the two benches came up and quickly died. The plants were very stunted due to the dry weather. Just in front another rare plant is appearing. This delicate little flower has clusters of white pinkish flowers. At the time of writing the actual flowers had not yet burst forth. In the 1960s I am told this Common Centaury was recorded in only one locality in Suffolk.

Although I did not see any frogs or toads moving to their spawning grounds they have obviously visited the pond as there was frogspawn amongst the plants. The plant life in and around the pond is including an ever increasing number of interesting flowers. You might have noticed water crowfoot, rather like a white buttercup. There are 13 varieties all designed to float or grow submerged.
